### WAGE GROWTH

Since 2013, healthcare has continued to see occupational wage growth



Wages have increased in the healthcare industry by 47 percent.

Physicians, as a group, saw the largest wage increases (60.8%)





The smallest wage increase between 2013 and 2023 was in Behavioral Health, with only 14.7 percent.

### REGISTERED NURSES



- The most in-demand healthcare occupation (according to online job postings) in 2023 was Registered Nurses, with 63,000 unique postings between January and December of 2023.

## TURNOVER

Healthcare saw less turnover in the last year than the rest of Michigan's labor force. In 2023, turnover in healthcare jobs was:
